



Second Workshop "Transnational Comparative Analysis" Dublin (Ireland) 12 – 15 of June 2013 Report of the workshop

Summary of the Evaluation Forms

30 evaluation sheets were received from participants at the end of the workshop. Ratings were consistently high on all subsections of the sheet.

Organisational Aspects: The minimum rating was 7 with the majority of responses at 9 and 10.

Contents: The minimum rating in this section was 4 in three responses. The great majority of responses were at 8,9 and 10.

Methodologies: Apart from four ratings of 4 and 5 the majority of responses were at 8,9 and 10.

Skills of the Experts: The level of rating was high in this section with almost all over 6 and the majority of responses at 8, 9 and 10. In the level of involvement question there was one response of 2, one of 3 and one of 5.

Atmosphere: The great majority of responses in this section were at 8,9 and 10. There were a small in Q5.3 of 6 with one being the lowest.

General Evaluation: The majority of responses in this section were at 9 and 10. There were a four at 7 or below.

Comments :

Only a small number of additional written comments received in this section and were, in general, positive and appreciative.
