JCN Justice Co-operation Network project (JUST/2011-2012/PEN/AG/2943)

- A European group of practitioners who manage prisoners in custody and post release.
- The countries participating are Germany (Mecklenburg-Western-Pomerania), Estonia, Ireland and Finland
- Associate partners are Germany (MoJ), Belgium, Netherlands (CEP), Slovak Republic and Slovenia.
- Pixel (Italy) is managing the project





Project objective

- To develop a European network and database of best practices in the transition management of high risk prisoners leaving custody
- To develop minimum standards and a best practice model for the managing and supervising of high risk offenders to ensure continuity and consistency
- To integrate existing informal links, expertise and best practice through shared learning, improvement of best practices among partners and to develop a strong, supporting European network of knowledge and expertise





WHAT HAS HAPPENED SO FAR?

Tallinn workshop in March 2013:

- Definition of a high risk offender was agreed upon
- "A high risk offender (a violent or sexual offender) is someone who presents a high probability to commit crimes which may cause very serious personal, physical or psychological harm."

Dublin workshop in June 2013

- Looked at current practice, issues and challenges in managing the transition phase of high risk offenders in all jurisdictions
- Encouraging the sharing of ideas and creating debate on best practices





- The objective of Helsinki workshop is to:

 PROGRAMMES FOR
 - DEALING WITH HIGH RISK OFFENDERS AND
 - THE DESIRED CONTINUITY OF TREATMENT AS WELL AS
 - TRANSITION MANAGEMENT
