

Male, 23 years old when sentenced to prison, 25 years old when committed a murder Judgment: life imprisonment 40 years old when released



- Sentenced to prison in 1993 for 4,5 years for attempted manslaughter
- Committed the murder in 1995 during a permission of leave
- Different victims: wife and former enemy (male)
- Psychiatric assessment in 1995: very dangerous for other people because of impaired ability to control aggressive drives and because of alcoholism
- Sentenced to prison in 1996 for life

- Very pro-criminal attitudes in the beginning of the imprisonment
- Started to use drugs in prison and started to quit the use in 2003.

- Sentence plan made in 2005 by former Allocation unit (Before The Assessment Centres were established)
 - The main goals of the sentence plan:
 - 1) Quit the use of alcohol
 - 2) Anti-criminal attitudes
 - 3) Better problem-solving skills for risky situations
 - 4) Occupational training



- Graduated as a carpenter in 2008
- Started to go to AA-meetings in 2009
- Performed an anger management course in 2009





- Requested to an open prison in October 2009
 - Psychological assessment in February 2010 by the Assessment Centre
- Transfer to an open prison in February 2010
- Transfer to a release unit in August 2010
 - Psychological counselling (14 sessions)



 In June 2011 Helsinki Court of Appeal ordered to release in April 2012.

- October 2011 supervised probationary freedom for six months (maximum length)
 - Supportive job, AA-meetings, psychological counselling, living in own apartment
 - December 2011 broke the terms and conditions of supervised probationary freedom (use of alcohol). Supervised probationary freedom was cancelled.
- Released in April 2012 from the release unit.
- Remaining sentence is three years in supervision.
 - Got a fixed-term job, accomplished an entrepreneurship course, works for church as a supported employee, lives in a relationship
- Supervision ends in April 2015.

SUMMARY

- Life sentence (12 years minimum)
- (2+) 13 years in closed prison
- 1 year in open prison
- 1 year in release unit
- 6 months for supervised probationary freedom
 - Accomplished 2 months after cancellation
- 3 years under supervision.
