## EUROPEAN TREATMENT AND TRANSITION MANAGEMENT OF HIGH RISK OFFENDERS PROJECT DUBLIN JUNE 13TH-14TH

 This is a European group of practitioners who manage prisoners in custody and post release. The representing Countries are Germany, Estonia, Finland and Ireland who are guided by Pixel (the project managers).



- The objective of the JCN Justice Cooperation Network project (JUST/2011-2012/JPEN/AG/2943) is to develop a European network and database of best practice in the transition management of high risk prisoners leaving custody. This includes the development of minimum standards and a best practice model for the managing and supervising of high risk offenders to ensure continuity and consistency.
- The project aims to integrate existing informal links, expertise and best practice through shared learning, improved best practice among partners and to develop a strong supporting European network of knowledge and expertise.

  We agreed and discussed the definition of the term 'high risk offender'
- 'A high risk offender is someone who presents a high probability to commit crimes which may cause very serious personal, physical or psychological harm'
